DR. RICHARD A. GLENN is Professor and Chair in the Department of Government and Political Affairs at Millersville University in Pennsylvania. He holds a B.A. in English from Carson-Newman College in Jefferson City, Tenn.; and a M.A. and Ph.D. in Political Science from the University of Tennessee. He is the author of two books, *The Right to Privacy* and *Unreasonable Searches and Seizures*, along with numerous articles, chapters and essays on a variety of U.S. political subjects. Of particular note is his scholarship on the inherent tension between liberty and security, a tension made more complicated by the modern realities of technology and terrorism in a post-9/11 world. His article, "Civil Liberties in an Age of Terrorism," published in *Trial: The Journal of the Association of Trial Lawyers in America*, was the lead article in the journal's symposium, "Preserving Civil Liberties: Can we Balance Security and Freedom?" Professor Glenn regularly teaches courses on the U.S. Constitution, civil liberties and civil rights, and the Supreme Court of the United States.
