

**An Act to Add Important Phone Numbers to the Back of Students' Eagle Cards**

- Whereas,** Eagle Cards currently only have the mag stripe on the back **and,**
- Whereas,** the blank space could be utilized to provide students with important, useful phone numbers to important services **and,**
- Whereas,** students currently do not have easy access to important numbers that could be useful in many different situations **and,**
- Whereas,** students' Eagle Cards would be the best place to house these important phone numbers because most students always have their eagle card with them,

**NOW THEREFORE,**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF  
TENNESSEE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY THAT**

**Section 1:** This bill shall be known as the "Eagle Card Important Numbers Act of 2021".

**Section 2:** This bill shall add the following phone numbers and the names of their services to the back of all student eagle cards.

**Section 2.1:** First number: "Tennessee Tech Police: 931-372-3234".

**Section 2.2:** Second number: "Tennessee Tech Counseling Center: 931-372-3331".

**Section 2.3:** Third number: "National Suicide Prevention Hotline: 800-273-8255".

**Section 2.4:** Fourth number: "Poison Control: 1-800-222-1222"

**Section 2.5:** Fifth number: "Tennessee Tech Health Services: 931-372-3320".

**Section 3:** It should be denoted that the first 4 numbers are 24-hour lines.

**Section 4:** In addition, it should be denoted that the fifth number is not a 24-hour line and that in case of emergencies, dial 911.

**Section 5:** Students with existing Eagle Cards shall not be required to obtain a new card that fulfills these requirements, unless they seek a replacement.

**Section 6:** This Bill shall take effect immediately upon passage by the Student Government Association, the welfare of the students requiring it.
