Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964

Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 is the Federal law that protects individuals from discrimination on the basis of their race, color, or national origin in programs that receive Federal financial assistance.

Facilities, programs, and services sponsored by Tennessee Tech University are available to all eligible persons regardless of race, color, national origin, age, sex or disability.
