

Biographical Sketch for Mr. Sam A. Huddleston, P.E.

As city environmental engineer, Mr. Huddleston coordinates the review and approval of private development plans, with an emphasis on storm-water quantity and quality, within the city of Murfreesboro. He assists with special projects that have an environmental emphasis within the city. Additionally, he serves as a technical resource on environmental issues to other city departments. Before joining the city of Murfreesboro, Mr. Huddleston served as a project manager for private environmental consulting firms in the areas of hazardous waste, Superfund, solid waste, storm water, soil and groundwater investigations and cleanup, and related environmental areas. Mr. Huddleston also worked as a graduate research assistant and lab assistant with the Center at Tennessee Technological University.

Mr. Huddleston received his bachelor's and master's degrees in civil engineering from Tennessee Tech, and he is a Tennessee Registered Professional Engineer. He is also a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, serving as the Nashville Branch past president and the Tennessee Section Environmental Committee chair. Mr. Huddleston was honored by the American Society of Civil Engineers when he won its Tennessee Section Young Engineer of the Year and Tennessee Section Government Engineer of the Year Awards in 2000 and 2003, respectively.
