PAULA F. CASEY



Paula F. Casey of Memphis, Tennessee, has dedicated more than 30 years to educating the public about the women's suffrage movement, especially Tennessee's pivotal role in the 19th Amendment's ratification in 1920. She produced a video in 1989 entitled "Generations: American Women Win the Vote," and helped publish the book, "The Perfect 36: Tennessee Delivers Woman Suffrage." She had the book made into an e-book and audiobook read by the co-author, Jan Sherman, Ph.D., in 2013.

Casey has been instrumental in getting public art about the suffragists placed across Tennessee. She served on the state committee that selected the bas relief plaque that hangs inside the Tennessee State Capitol in 1998. The Tennessee Woman Suffrage Monument was unveiled in Nashville's Centennial Park in August 2016 while she was president. She served as fiscal agent for the Sue Shelton White statue unveiled in front of Jackson's City Hall in 2017. She chairs the Memphis Suffrage Monument committee which will unveil its monument, "Equality Trailblazers," facing the Mississippi River by the University of Memphis law school later this fall. She co-founded the Tennessee Woman Suffrage Heritage Trail - www.tnwomansuffrageheritagetrail.com. She speaks about how the 19th Amendment would not have passed in this country without the First Amendment.
