BLUF

764 is a violent extremist network of people that utilize common social media platforms like Discord, Roblox, and TikTok to manipulate minors into performing acts of self-harm and sexual exploitation, and then extort the minor with threats of violence, swatting, and exposing the victim's illicit photos which often keeps the victims from reporting the abuse.

Background

The organization was founded by a 15-year-old Texas resident who named the group after his zip code [1], taking inspiration from other groups such as CVLT, a previous network that has engaged in sextortion of minors [1]. The group is driven by an ideology of causing unrest in hopes to destabilize society [1][2]. They often use social media platforms such as Discord, Roblox, etc. to target minors who are prone to self-harm or suffer from eating disorders [3][4]. They have associations with another violent group called No Lives Matter [1][4] and recently have begun to change their tactics towards violence over sextortion [1][4][5].

Summary (General Overview)

The online network known as 764 is a hotspot for violent extremism that is spreading across the world. The network preys on minors, specifically those with a history of mental health issues, and coerces them into performing illegal acts such as sharing illicit photos, harming themselves and others, vandalism and more. In order to intimidate victims out of coming forward, the network hires assailants who offer “Violence as a service” and engage in breaking windows, firebombing, and drive-by shootings [3]. They use these intimidation tactics and extort their victims by threatening to release the personal information and illicit photos that the victim has shared. The network fosters an environment where cruelty and extreme acts increase status within the organization. Following the arrest of two prominent figures in the 764 network, there has been an increase in violent propaganda. There have been multiple reports of various acts of violence across the world that have been carried out by people attempting to join 764 or glorify their violence [2][6]. The FBI continues to collect evidence to prosecute members of the 764 network.

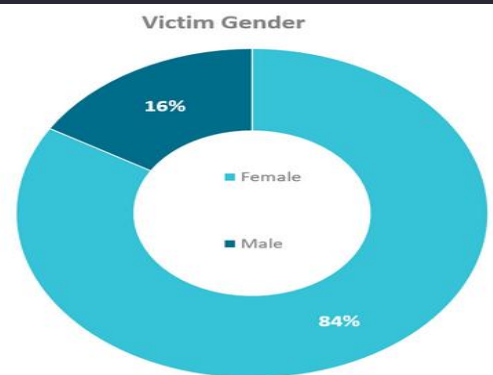
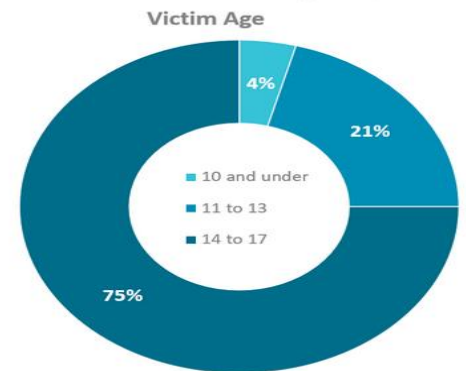
Analysis Summary

The online sextortion network known as 764 uses a mixture of manipulation tactics to coerce their victims into sharing personal information, illicit photos and videos, and eventually harming themselves or others [1][3][4]. The network consists of several subgroups that have their own agenda or goals. Because the network is spread across many subgroups, there is no clear ideology or shared beliefs across all members of the network. Historically, members of 764's *Inferno* subgroup will work together to stalk their victims and gather information about them, targeting minors with a history of mental health issues. A single member then makes contact with the victim, gaining their trust by being flirtatious, offering money, or social engineering [4]. Once the victim has built a foundation of trust with the member of 764, the member then asks or bribes the victim into sharing illicit photos and videos [1][4][5]. These videos are then shared within the group of 764 or sold online.

After two men were arrested in April of 2025 in connection with running the *Inferno* subgroup, a power vacuum opened emerged within the 764 network [4]. As a result, newer, younger, and more violence-prone individuals took over the network, shifting to glorifying and promoting extremist propaganda while committing acts of violence across the world [4]. In order to assist the members of 764's network in spreading violence and propaganda, five texts centered around the *No Lives Matter* group began to be circulated. These texts are *NLM Manhunt Guide*, *NLM Terror Guide*, *NLM Kill Guide*, *NLM x 764 Classified*, and the *Haters Handbook*. These texts focus on different subjects that aid 764 members in spreading propaganda and manipulating victims [7].

Because the group targets vulnerable children, parents, teachers, and other givers should be attentive to warning signs from children's behavior. Among these behaviors are signs of self-harm (i.e. cutting, burns, etc.), excessive isolation from family and peers, and siblings or pets seeming avoidant of the child[1][3][4][8]. It is important to not that these are not necessarily signs the child is being exploited by 764, but they are risk factors and signs of a child being in extreme distress and warrant compassionate and attentive care, such as medical and therapeutic intervention [3][8][9]. Educating children to be mindful of what sort of information can be found on children from social media as well as educating children on risks associated with sharing personal information online[3][8][9].
