CITL TechTrendsetter Grant

The 2025 CITL TechTrendsetters program included 11 grantees, with nine faculty completing the OLC Online Teaching Certificate and eight completing the full grant cycle. Collectively, these projects expanded classroom boundaries through ethical AI, virtual and simulated learning environments, adaptive and hybrid models, and accessibility-focused design, introducing innovations like AI-supported problem solving, counseling simulations, digital literacy credentialing, virtual reality applications, blended labs, and redesigned online graduate programs, all centered on accessible design, real-world application, and responsible technology use to strengthen learning, expand access, and better prepare students for evolving professional environments.
