

**TTU School Psychology Programs
Recommended Matriculation Plans**

These plans are designed to align the programs of study in School Psychology (Masters and Specialist) with the course offerings in order to streamline the advisement process and make the candidates' experience more efficient. The plans allow for some flexibility; however, deviation from a plan may increase the candidates' time in the program.

Current TTU graduate admission policy allows candidates to apply for a program in Fall, Spring, or Summer. Given the nature of course offerings (some every term--some once a year--and some on two-year cycles), and the fact that the complete School Psychology program is a three year program, it is necessary to consider certain years as "On-cycle" or "Off-cycle." For this reason, four plans are proposed:

- 1) Fall Entry On-cycle
- 2) Spring Entry On-cycle (entering Spring before normal cycle)
- 3) Fall Entry Off-cycle
- 4) Spring Entry Off-cycle

Candidates entering Summer will be regarded as "Fall Entry" for purposes of the plan, and will be advised to take Summer classes that do not interfere with their respective plan. The candidate will coordinate the inclusion of any background courses (and the Special Education survey course required of all first-time licensees) with their advisor with the understanding that, in some cases, extra time in-program may be necessary.

In order for these plans to work, the following must apply:

- 1) Candidates will be required to attend Summer terms.
- 2) Some courses will only be offered in Summer.
- 3) Spring Entry and Off-cycle entry may result in a 3.5 year program.
- 4) Fall Entry Off-cycle will require a Spring/Fall internship.
- 5) Fall Entry Off-cycle will require EDPY 7730 (Indiv. Testing) to be moved to EDS, and substituted for in MA.
- 6) The thesis option may result in a longer program.
