Scripted Texts and the edTPA

For residency candidates and student teachers, teaching in an elementary literacy classroom using a scripted text can be challenging. This is especially true when the scripted reading program is new to a school system and the administration requires that it is strictly followed. Add in the edTPA and stress levels soar! So, what is a teacher candidate to do? First, work with your mentor teacher to learn about her method of presenting direct instruction. Ask questions to find out what has worked for the mentor and what challenges they have come across. Second, find out if there is any room for outside resources or if the pacing schedule must be strictly adhered to. Finally, when writing your lesson plans for the edTPA, stick to the content that relates to YOUR edTPA. You're still going to teach spelling, grammar, and writing during the literacy block, however, it will not be part of your edTPA lesson plan. If your Elementary Literacy portfolio focuses on comprehension, build your lesson plan(s) from that perspective. Remember, you will still teach all of the required content, but your lesson plan should be specific to reading instruction. Don't be afraid to ask questions. Your mentor is there to help you learn what good teaching looks like. Take advantage of their expertise.
