

Getting Ready for the edTPA

The Office of Teacher Education has provided you with two calendars (Important Dates and Detailed Schedule) that outline your clinical experience from the very first day of your clinical experience. Notice that the schedule includes beginning dates for the **edTPA** which you will begin in **January**. In the meantime, as you begin to integrate into your placement classroom, there are some things you can do to prepare for Task 1.

- Take note of your students as you observe or assist your mentor teacher. Get to know their likes and dislikes, the way they ask and answer questions, how well they pay attention, and how they get along with others.
- Ask about accommodations or modifications your mentor makes for any of the students who have an IEP or are struggling learners. How does the mentor differentiate instruction for his/her students?
- Notice students who struggle to begin tasks or who don't finish tasks. Think about how you will address this when you are teaching.
- Take note of any academic language that naturally occurs in the classroom. Does the mentor teacher use sentence frames, does he/she ask or expect students to use content vocabulary? Are students engaged in discourse? In what ways is syntax represented during lessons?

While you are asked not to begin working on your edTPA until January, you can take this time to notice your students' behaviors and maintain anecdotal records that will support you as you begin working on Task 1. Learn who each student is as a learner and prepare yourself so you will be ready when the time comes.
