

HAVE YOU TAKEN YOUR CONTENT AREA PRAXIS II AND HAD THE SCORES SENT TO TENNESSEE TECH?

⇒ FALL 2018 MUSIC RESIDENTS (ONLY): Your Content Area Praxis exam must be passed and scores sent to Tennessee Tech by June 15, 2018 in order to begin Residency I.



⇒ **FALL 2018 STUDENT TEACHERS (ONLY):** You must take and pass ALL Praxis II exams and send scores to Tennessee Tech by **June 15, 2018**.

NOTICE: ALL PASSING SCORES MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE OFFICE OF TEACHER EDUCATION NO LATER THAN THE DEADLINES LISTED ABOVE.

For TTU students during the month of June, the cost is \$60 per person for a 2-year certification. Ms. Mahan currently has training sessions planned for:



STAYING ORGANIZED OVER THE SUMMER

Your classes are over! You have no finals, and you don't have summer classes. You're all finished, right? Well, let's not forget that school will still be there when summer is over, meaning there is plenty to stay on top of over the break. Though summer is our longest time off, time easily slips away from us, and we lose track of all the things that needed to be done at the end of spring semester. Getting organized early and thinking ahead will allow you to stay on top of things throughout the summer, helping you avoid having to scramble to get everything together when fall comes back around. Here are some pointers to get organized over the summer.

⇒ Go through all your class binders. Keeping old notes, especially content and theory notes, can be helpful for Praxis exams, but you do not need every single thing you did in class. On the other hand, it is not always a good idea to throw your whole binder away just to avoid hoarding.

Oftentimes, realistically sifting through notes and projects after your class finishes is needed. Compiling them into

smaller folders will help save space, and you will also have everything neat and easy to find when you need to go back and look for lesson ideas and study materials. This also allows you to reuse binders after you clean them out – a way to save money on school supplies!

⇒ Don't forget about school. After you have worked hard all school year, all you really want is a break, so it is easy to forget about any outstanding school deadlines that must be met over the summer. Unfortunately, this is a slippery-slope. Though it is hard to get motivated to study for Praxis exams and stay up-to-date with other residency requirements over the summer break, summer is actually a great time to do so. ⇒ If your advisor recommends that you take the Praxis exams over the summer, then it is in your best interest to do exactly that. It will give you enough time to study as opposed to cramming during the semester and will keep you from having to scramble and retake tests if necessary right before the deadline. (On the other hand, if your advisor recommends you wait until after the summer then, by all means, wait.) Studying over the summer is not so bad if you pace yourself and balance your schedule with plenty of time to relax.

 \Rightarrow Looking for a job? Start early! If you are looking for a

summer job, it is a good idea to begin applying early to as many places as you can. Some businesses will keep resumes on file and call you weeks later when a position opens up, so getting your foot in the door early will be beneficial. Many businesses also have online applications, but if the employer has the option to apply by paper and in person, it is important to be professional and dressed nicely when turning in the application. Job employers truly pay attention to how you dress

and act, even if it is just for a part-time, minimumwage job.

Hopefully, these tips will help you stay organized on the front end for the summer. Organizing class notes and applying for jobs early will give you more time when summer break actually gets underway. At the same time, making the most of this intermission in regards to deadlines and Praxis exams will also help you immensely in the long —run if your advisor has recommended that you do so. As the semester comes to an end, not giving up and pressing through will always help you tie up all the loose ends with your classes and allow you to better enjoy your summer break.
