

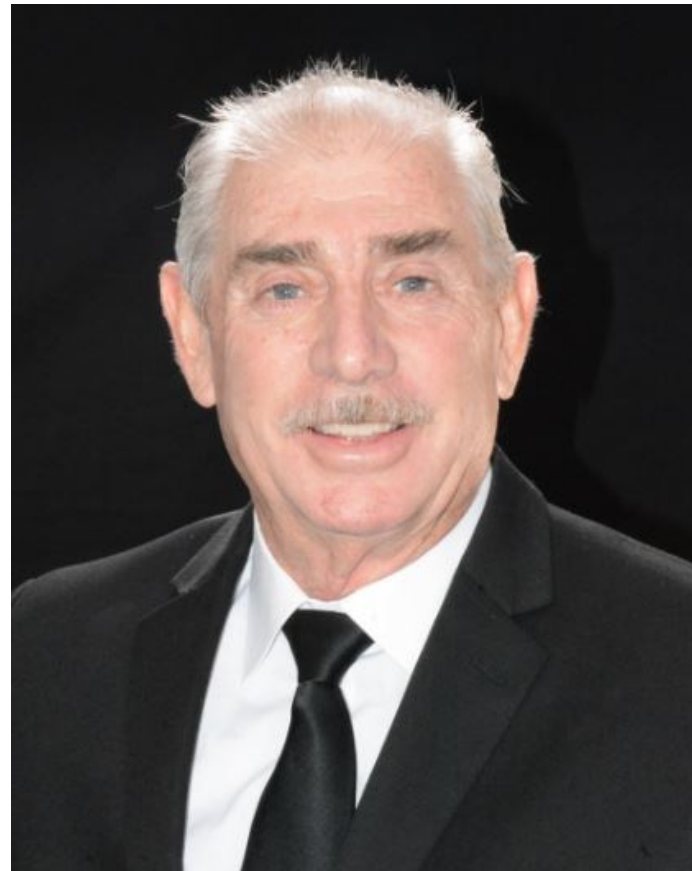

While at Tennessee Tech University, Bob Vick was a member of the TTU Golden Eagle football team, the student senate and was battalion commander in the ROTC Brigade. After graduation, Bob was commissioned by the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers, and served during the Vietnam War. Upon discharge from the Army, he worked for the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers in Germany, and later for the engineering consulting firm Michael Baker Jr, Inc., in Jackson, Mississippi.

In 1975, Bob became a partner in the consulting firm Box, Cannella, Howland, Maffett and Rinks, prior to starting his own consulting engineering and construction firm in 1978. He holds a Professional Engineer license in Tennessee, Mississippi, North Carolina and Texas. He is also a registered land surveyor in Tennessee and Mississippi. Bob is recognized as a forensics expert in the field of manufactured housing and construction.

Bob served on the National Science Foundation's committee for development of standards for ion exchange for water treatment. He was a member of the TTU Engineering Development Foundation, and the TTU ROTC Advisory Board. He also was a member of the American Society of Civil Engineers, American Water Works Association, American Society of Military Engineers, and American Society of Forensic Engineers. Bob currently serves as chairman of the Board of Adjustments and Appeals, and the Sewer Regulations Appeals Board for the City of Cookeville. He is an adjunct professor at Volunteer State Community College.

Bob has three sons, all Tennessee Tech alumni, one daughter, and six grandchildren. He and his wife Cheryl reside in Cookeville.
