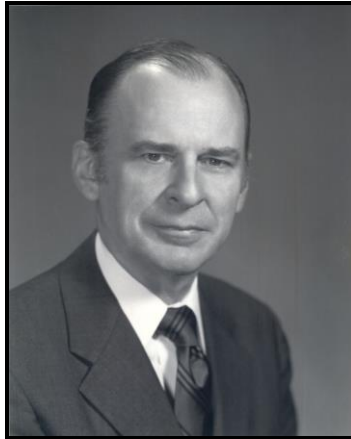


## 1981 Engineer of Distinction

### Citation

Landon Lyon (Lynn) Corbin, Vice President of Engineering for Aluminum Company of America, was born October 30, 1916, in Winston-Salem, North Carolina.

He received a Bachelor of Science degree in electrical engineering in 1949 from North Carolina State College. He then joined Alcoa as a staff electrical engineer at Davenport Works in Iowa.

Mr. Corbin became division engineer of the Davenport foil mill in 1957 and in 1959 advanced to works electrical maintenance superintendent. He was assistant project engineer and engineering consultant at Imperial Aluminum Co. in Swansea, Wales, between 1961 and 1964. He returned to Davenport in 1964 as assistant chief engineer.

In 1966, Mr. Corbin was transferred to Alcoa Equipment Development Division as chief engineer. He became engineering manager of the Tennessee Operations in 1968 and moved to Pittsburgh in 1972 as Alcoa's assistant chief electrical engineer. He advanced to chief electrical engineer in 1973 and general manager of engineering in 1975 and was elected vice president-engineering in August, 1976.

Mr. Corbin is a member of the Engineers' Society of Western Pennsylvania, Corporate Engineering Forum Advisory Committee, American Association of Engineering Societies, Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers, and the Pennsylvania Society of Professional Engineers. He is service team coordinator of the Alcoa Explorer Program, a member of the Board of Engineering Visitors at the University of Tennessee, and on the Industrial Advisory Committee of the National Society of Professional Engineers. He was chairman of the Tennessee Tech Engineering Advisory Committee. Mr. Corbin is a registered engineer in Tennessee and Pennsylvania and a retired Lieutenant Colonel in the U.S. Air Force Reserve.
