Terry Warren holds the position of vice president, strategic planning for Willis Corroon Americas, the US and Canadian arm of Willis Corroon Group. Previously, Mr. Warren also served in a dual role as president and chief executive officer of MedTrac, Inc. and as senior vice president of business development for WCASC. Both are wholly owned subsidiaries of Willis Corroon Group.

In his MedTrac position, he had bottom-line responsibility for overall management and development of MedTrac's operations nationwide. For WCASC, his responsibilities include directing the marketing of integrated claims, medical management, and managed care services to clients and prospects.

Before joining WCASC and MedTrac, Mr. Warren served as a management consultant with Columbia/HCA and was instrumental in the original concept development for their managed care services. His work in the health care industry included both domestic and international assignments.

Mr. Warren received his undergraduate degree in industrial engineering from Tennessee Technological University and serves on the Industrial Advisory Board of the Department of Industrial and Manufacturing Engineering.
