Janey Camp, Ph.D. is a research associate Professor in Civil and Environmental Engineering at Vanderbilt University, and a licensed civil engineer in the State of Tennessee, a certified Geographic Information Systems professional, and a certified flood plain manager.

Camp grew up in Middle Tennessee, obtained bachelor's and master's degrees from Tennessee Tech University and a doctorate from Vanderbilt. Her research and consulting work involves utilizing tools, such as GIS, to address challenging issues related to infrastructure; and to transform the results into information and tools to help inform the public and decision makers. She has led or has been heavily involved in projects which have a key focus on investigating the impacts of climate change and natural hazards on transportation and water infrastructure systems, with funding from TDOT, the Federal Highway Administration, USACE, and others. Camp's work has resulted in numerous journal publications and conference presentations. She is serving on several local to national engineering boards and committees.

She Camp is the recipient of the ASCE Tennessee Section 2011 Young Engineer of the Year Award, the 2012 ASCE Citizen Engineer Award, the 2015 Nashville Emerging Leaders Award in Environment and Sustainability, among others. She currently serves as past president of the Tennessee Society of Professional Engineers (TSPE) and on ASCE's National Committee on America's Infrastructure, assisting with the both the 2013 and 2017 Infrastructure Report Cards. She is married to Clint Camp, also a civil engineering graduate of Tech. They have two children: Eliza and Sam.
