Super-Important Reminders

- IMPORTANT UPDATE (7/31): Because of changes made by our athletics conference (Ohio Valley Conference), we have determined that there is no longer a need to have a full band camp. This means, woodwinds and brass will not attend camp during the week of August 16. All percussion and Student Leadership will have an abbreviated camp during this week.
- 2. Every member of The Golden Eagle Marching Band (new and returning) is responsible for submitting the online Drill Spot Reservation Form. This is a student information form we use, in addition to your class registration, to assign drill spots to each member of the marching band.

- We must have this information to prepare for camp and our fall season. Submission should be completed <u>no later than Saturday</u>, August 1, 2020. *If you missed this deadline, contact Dr. Miller immediately*.
- 3. In addition to submitting the Drill Spot Reservation Form, *ALL* members must register for the marching band class (MUS1033-001; CRN: 80861). Freshmen and transfer students can register during your SOAR session.
- 4. Weekly marching band practice is scheduled on M/W/F from 3:50-5:50 p.m. Attendance is required of all members.
- 5. Because of COVID-19 related concerns, the Golden Eagle Marching Band will not be wearing traditional uniforms this year. Members will wear alternative uniforms as described below. T-shirts, ball caps and sweatshirts will be provided to members at no cost. You will not need gloves or marching shoes this year.

Warm Weather: Khakis shorts, GEMB t-shirt, game day ball cap and sneakers.

Cold Weather: Blue jeans, GEMB sweatshirt, game day ball cap and sneakers.

Residence Hall & Meal Plan Information

IMPORTANT UPDATE (7/31): Because we will not be having a full band camp, students who play a woodwind or brass instrument will not move-in early as previously announced. You will receive your move-in date and time from the Residential Life office. Please contact their office directly if you have any questions. **Student Leadership** and all percussion will receive an email from Dr. Miller with move-in instructions.

- All Student Leadership Staff will check-in on Sunday, August 16.
- All percussion (drumline & front ensemble) will check-in on Tuesday, August 18.

Students who have purchased meal plans may begin using them starting at dinner on Wednesday, August 19. Members will be responsible for all meals before this time. What New Members Can Expect

New members are sometimes apprehensive about what to expect from the university marching band experience. Here's a few things you can expect!

- The biggest difference between high school and university marching bands is the absence of a competition circuit. University bands work very hard to produce superior shows, but the overall focus is contributing to and enhancing the game-day experience. This includes performances in parades, at tailgate events, and the pregame and halftime shows.
- University band rehearsals are often shorter and fewer in number. Older students can learn new concepts and skills more quickly, so rehearsals are fast-paced, efficient, and highly productive.
- The Golden Eagle Marching Band performs one halftime show for the season. This allows us to focus on performing drill and music that is high-quality and fun!
- Your student leaders (aka "Student Leadership Staff") and returning members are wonderful people. They have worked hard to make The Golden Eagle Marching Band a great success. Follow their example and listen to their instructions and you'll have a great experience.
- Again, much about this season will be VERY different, but, with your patience, care and positive
 spirit, I believe it will be one you can be proud of. We can't wait to meet you and welcome you to the

Camp & Season Essentials

Members should have the following items for the band camp and the upcoming season.

- 1. Hand sanitizer
- 2. Face mask/face covering (A mask will be provided by the university, but you should also bring your own)
- 3. Personal water cooler or hydration backpack (i.e. <u>Coleman Cooler</u> or <u>Camelbak</u>)
- 4. Athletic shoes (no sandals)
- 5. Sunglasses
- 6. Ball cap or wide-brimmed hat
- 7. Khakis shorts for your alternative uniform (in good condition—no tears or rips)
- 8. Blue jeans for your alternative uniform (in good condition—no tears or rips)
- 9. Sunscreen and bug repellant
- 10. Comfortable clothes for outdoor rehearsals
- 11. Alarm clock
- 12. Any medication you may need
