Concentrations

- Agency Counseling (Ed.S.)
 prepares you to help adults
 or children face everyday life
 problems. Agency counselors often
 work in institutions, agencies or
 private practices.
- Case Management & Supervision
 (M.A.) prepares you to provide
 resources and referral information
 to clients and offer assistance to
 clients with medical issues, human
 services, family functioning, mental
 health, educational entities, the
 legal systems and other services.
- Educational Psychology (M.A. or Ed.S.) is a general non-licensure based concentration allowing for considerable flexibility in your program of study.

- Mental Health Counseling (M.A.)
 graduates often obtain licensed
 professional counselor licenses
 with a mental health service
 provider endorsement, which
 allows them to work with more
 diagnostic and clinical cases.
 Licensure requires supervised
 clinical experience beyond the
 degree requirements. Special
 emphasis is placed on personal
 and professional development to
 become an effective mental health
 service provider in public or private
 settings.
- School Counseling (M.A. or Ed.S.)
 lets you develop competencies
 in counseling and consultation
 needed to work with children at the
 elementary and secondary levels
 with a range of personal, social and
 academic issues. This program is
 accredited by CAEP.
- School Psychology (M.A. or Ed.S.)
 prepares you to assess, diagnose
 and intervene on behalf of at-risk
 children in a wide range of school based situations. You will work
 with students from 3 to 22 years
 old who are dealing with personal,
 behavioral and educational
 problems. This program is
 accredited by CAEP.

Faculty

Graduate Assistantships

Teaching Assistants — A limited number of teaching assistantships may be available that include paid tuition and fees along with a monthly stipend in return for work teaching undergraduates. The responsibilities of teaching assistants include (but are not limited to) assisting faculty with grading, teaching and providing help sessions to students.

Research Assistants — A limited number of research assistantships may be available, contingent upon funding availability. Students with research assistantships are expected to conduct research as directed by the grant and supervising faculty.
