Define Outcome:

 Provide appropriate training to produce competent professionals in the concentrations we offer to meet State and national standards.

Assessment Methods:

- 1. Counselor Preparation Comprehensive Examination (CPCE) Comprehensive exam by the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and other Education Professionals (CACREP) for professional counselors.
- 2. School Counseling Praxis Exam ETS test that measures candidate's knowledge and professional practice in School Counseling.
- 3. Enrolled Graduate Student Survey The survey is administered annually to all students in the Counseling & Psychology graduate program. Questions ask students to rate Instructor Effectiveness, Relevance of Courses, Clinical Experience, Real-World Experience, Recommend to Others, and Overall Excellence.

Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):

Scores from the CPCE will meet or exceed national means; scores from the Praxis will meet or exceed the state means. Results from the in-house Enrolled Graduate Student Survey will remain positive across all of the areas we measure (Note: This is an update in language from "should remain above-average" because of the language used for this scale).

Results and Analysis:

Our CPCE data continue to exceed the national data, and that difference is increasing, as shown below in overall scores.
