**SLO 1: FOUNDATIONAL KNOWLEDGE OF ART AND DESIGN PRINCIPLES**

**Define Outcome:**

Students will have foundational knowledge of the principles and elements of design and be able to apply them in the creation of unique works of art.

**Assessment Methods:**

Successful completion of the final project in Foundations Studio I demonstrating the ability to apply the principles and elements of design into a cohesive and compelling work of art. (Direct assessment).

**Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):**

Successful completion of 70% or higher on the final project for Foundations Studio I.

**Results and Analysis:**

Successful completion of the final project in Foundations Studio I demonstrates the students' knowledge and ability to apply the principles and elements of design.

**Use of Results to Improve Outcomes:**

It is possible that the one failing student in Foundations Studio I withdrew from University altogether; knowing this information would be useful. If so, efforts can be made to address Freshmen retention which also affects success rates for this course. Foundations Studio I is typically taken during the first semester of freshmen year which is when we have observed the highest frequency of university drop-out amongst our students.

**SLO 2: STUDENTS WILL HAVE FOUNDATIONAL DRAWING SKILLS.**

**Define Outcome:**

Students will demonstrate foundational drawing skills required to articulate space, form and ideas.

**Assessment Methods:**

Successful completion of Drawing I final project which displays synthesis of techniques and concepts. Direct assessment.

**Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):**

Successful completion of "C" or higher in Drawing I and one of the following: Drawing II, Technical Drawing, or Computer Aided Drawing for the Artist.

**Results and Analysis:**

Successful completion of Drawing I, along with successful completion of a second drawing course provides students with the skills and knowledge to meet this student learning outcome.

Final grade in either Survey I or Survey II. (Direct assessment)

**Criteria for Success (Thresholds for Assessment Methods):**

75% or better in final semester grades.

**Results and Analysis:**

Successful completion (70%) of Art History Survey I and Art History Survey II provides students with the requisite knowledge and understanding.
