Mission: Within the context of the University's mission, the mission of the Department is to provide students with a quality liberal arts education that prepares them for a rapidly changing world and a variety of work environments and post-graduate educational possibilities.

The Department of Sociology and Political Science has the primary mission of offering strong academic programs in sociology, criminology and criminal justice, social work and political science. It provides students with a quality liberal arts education that prepares them for a rapidly changing world and a variety of work environments and postgraduate educational possibilities. Students are educated to not only master a diverse body of knowledge but also to think critically, analyze data, and clearly communicate what they know and discover. Recognizing that we live in an increasingly technological and diverse world, we seek to incorporate technological expertise and appreciation of human diversity into our courses. The Department also strives to serve the wider university, the Upper Cumberland region, and the nation through research and public service.

Program Goals:

PG 1: The Program of Political Science will have a sufficient number of students, at least 70 majors, to sustain a strong educational program.

The Program will be involved in recruitment initiatives such as participation in TTU Recruitment events.

PG 2: Students will judge that a sufficient number of curricular and co-curricular activities were offered by the program as reported by our students.

Student Learning Outcomes:

SLO 1: Political Science majors will develop knowledge of their discipline.

Political Science majors will demonstrate knowledge of their discipline at a level comparable to the national mean on the ETS major field exam.

SLO 2: Majors in Political Science will demonstrate critical thinking skills at a level comparable to the national mean.

Majors in Political Science will demonstrate critical thinking skills at a level comparable to the national mean.

SLO 3: Majors in Political Science will be capable of effective oral and written communication.

Students will report confidence in their abilities to write and speak clearly and effectively as measured by the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE).

SLO 4: Majors in Political Science in the Legal Studies Concentration be prepared for legal study.

Majors in Political Science in the Legal Studies Concentration will indicate preparedness for legal study.

Assessment Methods:

PG 1: Sufficient number of students

1. Tracking sheet of the number of Political Science majors
2. Tracking the number of recruitment activities

PG 2: Sufficient number of curricular and co-curricular activities

1. Annual survey of majors delivered through Qualtrics and assesses student satisfaction with curricular and co-curricular offerings in Political Science.

SLO 1: Develop knowledge of the discipline

1. Educational Testing Services (ETS) major field examination is administered each fall and spring semester to all enrolled majors with senior classification. The ETS exam outlines content questions related to Comparative Government and Politics, International Relations, and United States Government and Politics.

Performance at a level above or comparable to the national mean on the ETS Major Field Examination is defined as Tech students having a mean score no lower than 1.644 standard errors below the national mean, the level at which a difference would become statistically significant at the 0.05 level.

SLO 2: Demonstrate critical thinking skills

1. Educational Testing Services (ETS) major field examination is administered each fall and spring semester to all enrolled majors with senior classification. The ETS exam measures Analytical and Critical Thinking, Methodology, and Political Thought.

Performance at a level above or comparable to the national mean on the ETS Major Field Examination is defined as Tech students having a mean score no lower than 1.644 standard errors below the national mean, the level at which a difference would become statistically significant at the 0.05 level.

SLO 3: Effective oral and written communication

1. Political Science analyzes the results from the National Survey of Student Engagement (NSSE) in order to assess student confidence in their abilities to write and speak clearly and effectively. The results of the National Survey of Student Engagement allow us to assess how well our students perform on learning Outcome 3 by determining their

capabilities in effectively using written and oral skills. These results are compared to other TTU students and to our Carnegie peer institutions.

2. The threshold of acceptability is improvement from the freshman year to the senior year in critical thinking skills on the NSSE data, and this threshold was met.

SLO 4: Prepared for legal study

1. Annual survey of majors assesses students in the Legal Studies Concentration preparation for legal study.

Results:

PG 1: *The threshold of 70 majors was met and all TTU recruitment events were attended.*

SLO 4: Prepared for legal study

In previous years, students were administered a Qualtrics survey. That was not given in 2019-2020 due to the combined student challenges with a regional F4 tornado and a mid-semester conversion to on-line courses due to the COVID-19 global pandemic. However, individual Exit Interviews were given to four students who took courses in the Legal Studies concentration and 100% of them indicated they felt prepared for legal study. Of these students, all four had also competed in the POLS Moot Court competition course that was a QEP-grant recipient course in 2019. One of these majors is currently admitted to Vanderbilt Law School and one is currently applying to various law schools; two of the above students are saving up money for future law school admission.

Modifications for Improvement:

SLO 3: Effective oral and written communication

Based on program review results and faculty observation of students writing, a rubric for assessment will be added for the Political Science 3000: Data Analysis course. This course is required of all Political Science majors and the rubric will measure oral and written components.

SLO 4: Prepared for Legal Studies

The faculty will be adding a set of questions with the Major Field as currently done in Sociology. A multiple-choice exam covering topics in Political Science-Legal Studies developed by faculty in the department with an expected passage rate of 50% will be administered.
