

# Survey Results Summary

The attached survey was administered to students in the nine classes participating in the Spring 2023 OER Program. The primary purpose of this program is to increase faculty's use of quality, no-cost course materials. Students in these courses did not have to purchase any required course materials, saving over \$94,000 during Spring 2023. This survey aimed to gather data on the students completing the survey and feedback about their use of the no-cost course materials. Although we refer to the no-cost course materials as OERs, faculty could use a combination of free resources, OERs, and library materials as long as the cost to the students was \$0.

Here are some highlights from the survey:

- Over 95% of respondents found the OERs to be about the same or better than traditional textbooks..
- Only 4% were unsatisfied with the OERs.
- If there were two sections of a course offered in the future, one with traditional textbooks and one with free course materials, only 1% of students would specifically choose the section with traditional textbooks.
- The students expressed much appreciation for no-cost course materials in the open-ended comments.

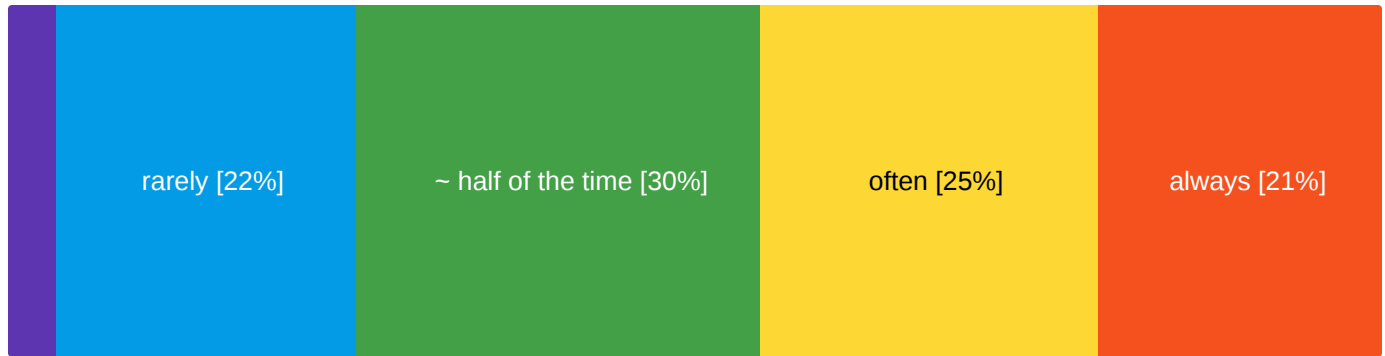

Approximately how often did you use the required textbooks/materials for this course during the semester?

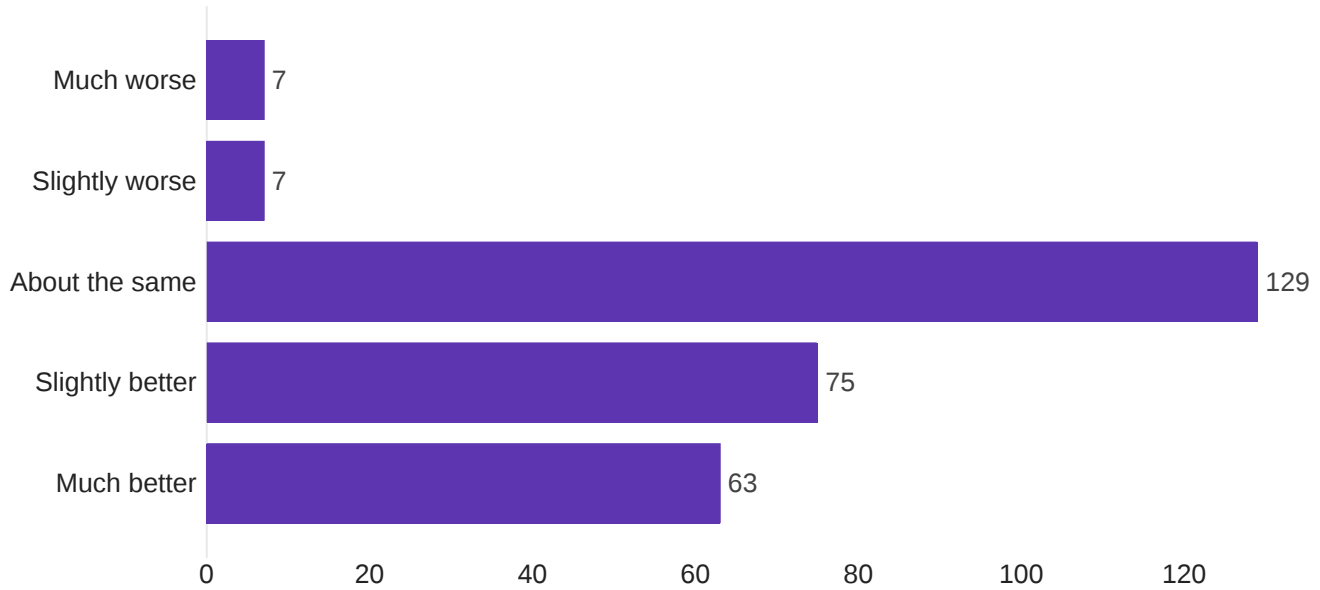

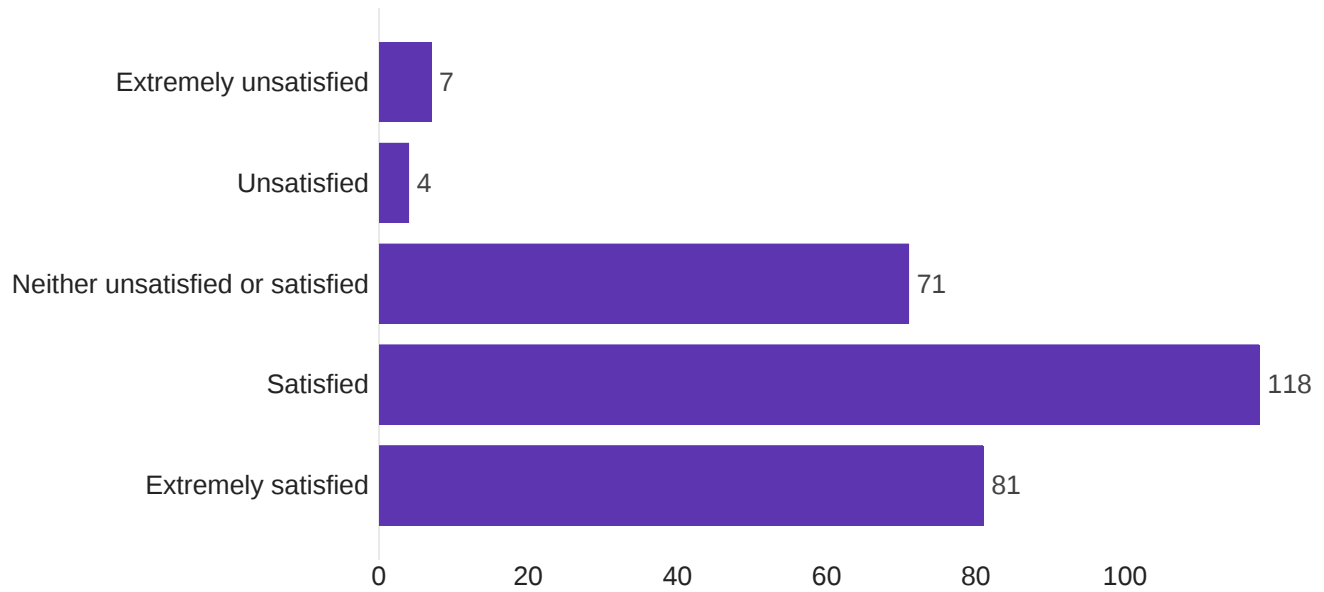
How would you compare the quality of the required textbooks/materials used in this course to your other courses?

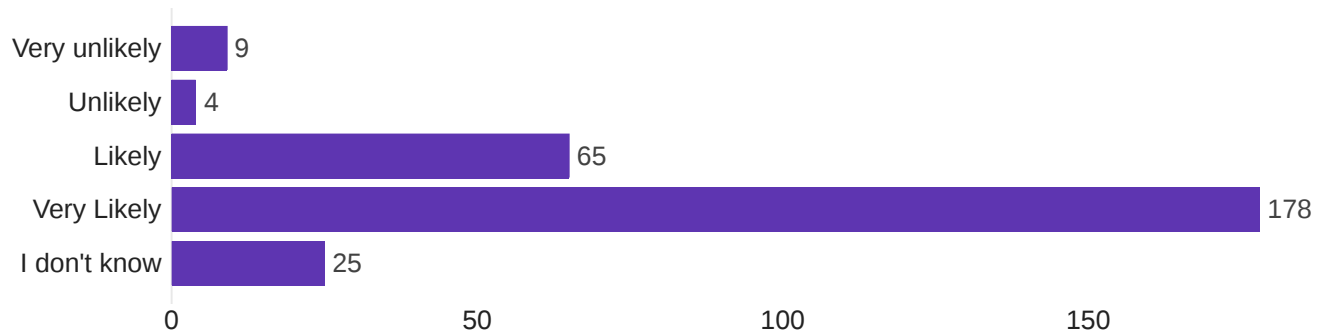
Overall, how satisfied are you with the required textbooks/materials used in this course?

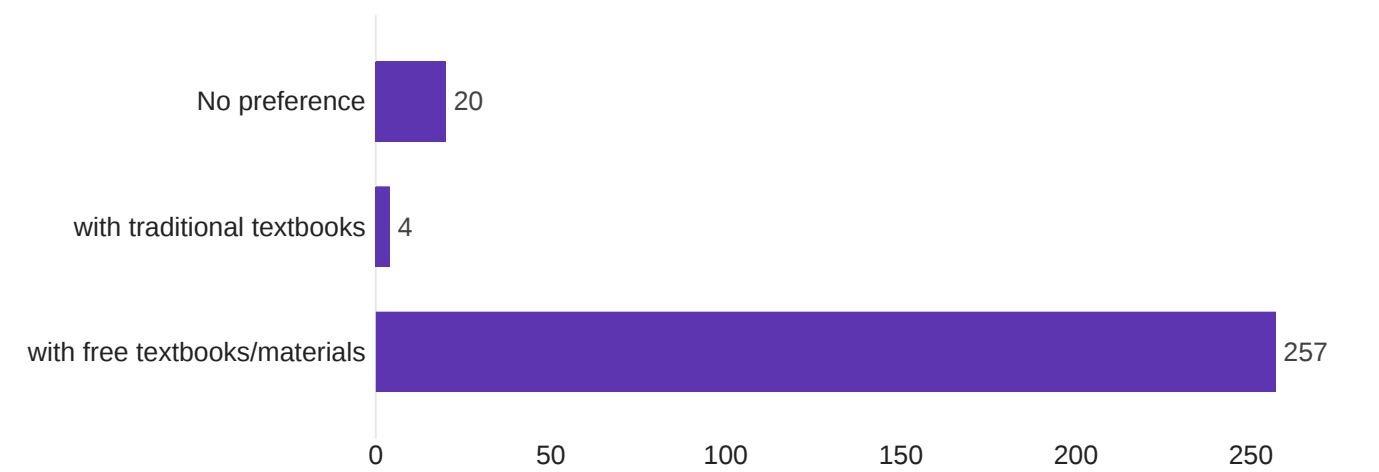
How likely are you to enroll in a future course that uses free required textbooks/materials like those used in this course?
