CRIME STATISTICS CHEC

COOKEVILLE HIGHER EDUCATION CENTER (CHEC)

CHEC is located at 1000 Neal Street, Cookeville, TN 38501. In 2015, Tennessee Tech, Vol State Community College (VCSS), and Nashville State Community College (NCSS) partnered to bring a broader selection of quality academic courses to students aspiring to earn their associate degrees. Tennessee Tech's initial role was administrative in nature, and Tennessee Tech students did not attend classes there during the first partnership year.

Tennessee Tech University Police patrol and provide professional law enforcement services to CHEC. Crimes and other emergencies at this location should be reported to the University Police officer on duty. Comments, concerns, or questions about safety and security at the CHEC campus should be directed to the University Police Department.

Per agreement, Title IX responsibilities at CHEC are shared by Tennessee Tech and VSCC. Whichever institution has jurisdiction over the respondent, or accused, takes the lead on sexual misconduct complaints. That institution's policies and procedures will apply throughout the process.

For the ASR, Tennessee Tech and VSCC report crimes and Title IX for areas that each controls and/or manages. They also report crimes and Title IX for areas that are shared, such as common spaces, parking, streets, etc.

The chart below includes CHEC's 2015 and 2016 Clery crime statistics. There are no statistics available for 2014. There is no student housing at CHEC.

Beginning July 1, 2017, VSCC will assume full administrative responsibility for CHEC.
