HALLS/APARTMENT INFO

All residence halls/apartments have basic cable, free laundry facilities, electronic card access, land line telephones, vending machines, lobby television and study areas. All residence halls/apartments are tobacco free. As a matter of fact, Tennessee Tech University's entire campus is tobacco and smoke free.

INTERNET & WIFI

Internet services are available in all halls/apartments. Information Technology Services assists students in connecting to the internet. Please visit its.tntech.edu for complete details, instructions, policies and procedures.

TELEPHONES

All rooms include a telephone with local telephone service and a voice mailbox option.

DINING

There are two places in the residence halls to get food; Papa John's Pizza is located in the Outtakes convenience store in McCord lobby, and both the C-Store and The Teaching Kitchen are located in the lobby of the Perch. Other dining facilities on campus are in the Roaden University Center, the Volpe Library, the Laboratory Science Commons and the Burnett Student Recreation Center. Freshmen living on campus are required to have a meal plan. SECURITY

All hall residents must share responsibility for maintaining a safe

and secure community. Through routine drills residents are prepared for emergencies.

All residents must enter/exit from the main lobby entrance. This main lobby entrance is equipped with an electronic card reading system allowing only residents into the living areas of the hall. There are 24 blue-light emergency telephones located on campus as well as exterior hall phone boxes to enhance student safety and security. Escort services are also available any time on campus by calling university police. Each residence hall and areas of Tech Village apartments have cameras installed at the entrance and exits for the safety of the students.

RESIDENCE HALL ASSOCIATION (RHA)

The RHA is the governing body for all Tennessee Tech University hall/apartment residents. The purposes of the RHA are to: work primarily for the support of all residents; coordinate activities; serve as a channel of student opinion; ensure that students are aware of their responsibilities and rights; encourage the development of responsibilities, character, leadership, scholarship, citizenship; and create a spirit of unity and service. Each residence hall has a hall council to help

provide or enhance hall programs and activities, and to assist the operation of the RHA. All residential students are encouraged to get involved in the leadership opportunities provided through the RHA and hall council.

HALL COUNCIL

Each residence hall and Tech Village has a residence council or hall council. This student group serves as a voice for its residential area as well as a programming board for activities within their area. Each council meeting is open to all residents of their hall, and the executive board is elected from this group. All residents are encouraged to participate and take advantage of these leadership opportunities.

STAFFING

A resident assistant (RA) is assigned to each hall floor and six RAs are assigned to Tech Village. The RA is a peer student who helps to provide individual support, direction and the initiation of floor/hall activities. A hall director is a professional staff member also living in the halls who provides leadership, training and additional student and staff support. An assistant director is also a professional staff member who provides centralized direction, support and training for their area of campus.



HOW TO APPLY FOR HOUSING

NEW STUDENTS

Students may begin applying for campus housing on Oct. 1 for the following spring or academic year. All housing application processes must be done online via the Tech Residential Life web page at the the three page, there is a section for new incoming students that includes the link to the housing application. Note the following information regarding completion of your housing application process:

- Students wishing to apply for campus housing will first need to apply for admission to Tennessee Tech University.
- For more information or questions regarding your Tech admission status, contact the admissions office at admissions@tntech.edu.
- The admissions office will assign a Tech ID (T) number AND a Tech email account. You will need to set up your Tech email account prior to beginning your campus housing application.
- A housing deposit is required to complete your housing application

- process (see tntech.edu/reslife for current deposit amount).
- This deposit must be paid online with a MasterCard, Visa, Discover or American Express card.
- Upon completion of your application you will receive an email confirming your application has been completed and submitted.
- Students will have the opportunity to select their room, depending on availability of the space.
- Assignments will be made based upon application completion date (first come, first served).

- Assignment emails are sent by the end of May.
- For Tech Village, you will be notified upon apartment availability.
- The Residential Halls follow the academic fall and spring calendar.
- There are three application housing terms: fall, spring and summer.
 Applications are for a full academic year. We also have summer applications available for students enrolled in summer school.

REQUESTING A ROOMMATE

All roommate requests must be mutual and need to be made on your housing application through the housing portal. Note that both students will need to start the assignment process to include each other on the application. If applicable, you may complete your application and later return to it to make any changes in your housing preferences including roommate requests.



ASSIGNMENT PROCESS

HOUSING TERMS

There are three application housing terms: fall, spring and summer. Applications are for a full academic year. Those who are applying for summer housing must live here for the fall/spring school year.


