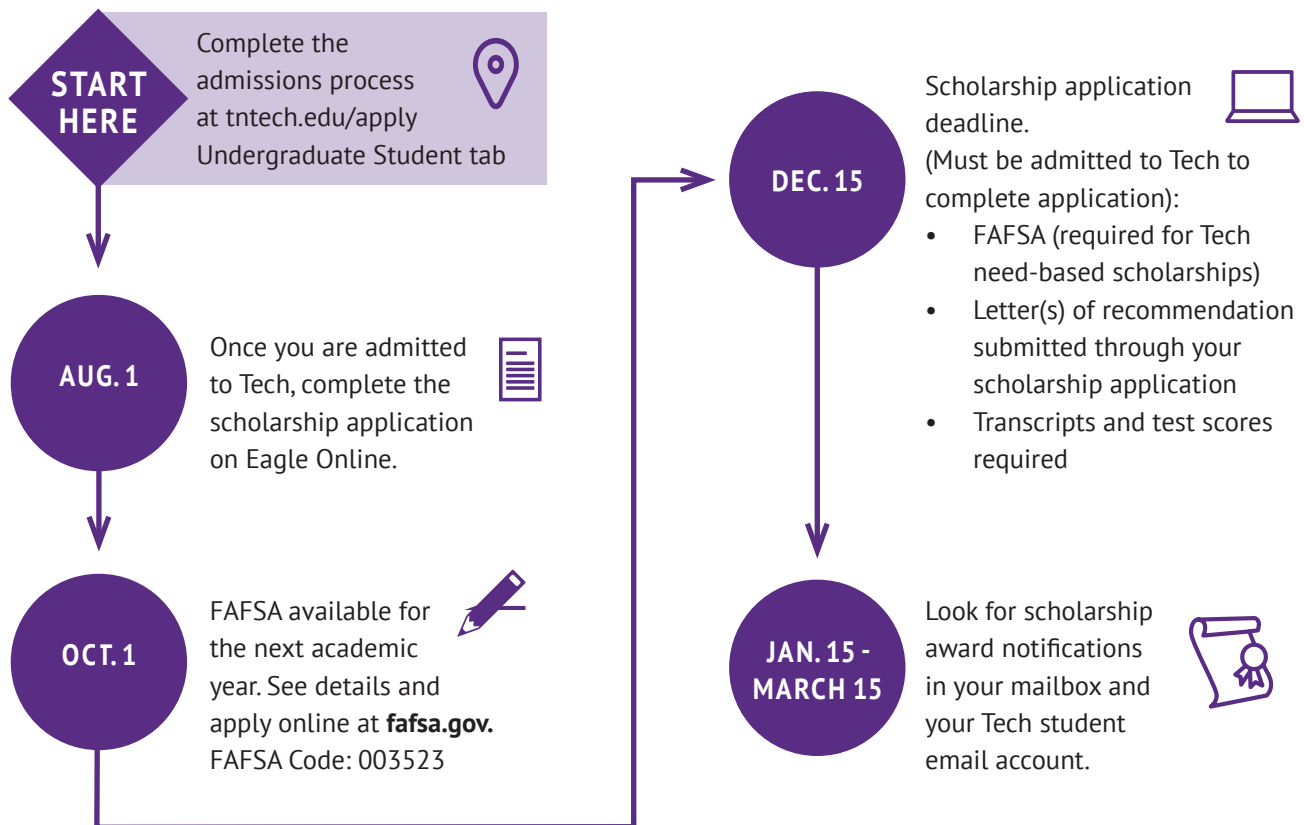

NEW FRESHMEN

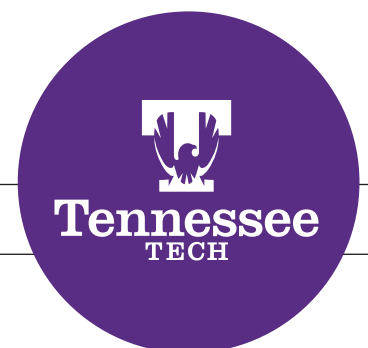
Tennessee Tech offers more than 600 departmental and university scholarships. To be considered for these, you must apply through Eagle Online (student tab). Submit the application by **Dec. 15** and any required supporting materials by the **Jan. 15** deadline to be considered for all scholarships and grants for which you are eligible. Visit tntech.edu/scholarships for detailed procedures. Funds are limited, therefore all scholarships are competitive. You must be admitted to Tech to apply.

2019-2020 Freshman Scholarships & Grants

To be considered for all Tennessee Tech scholarships and grants students must:

1. Be admitted to the university by **Dec. 1**.
2. Complete the FAFSA by **Dec. 15** and
3. Submit the Scholarship Application by **Dec. 15, 2018**, and
4. Submit all required supporting material by **Jan. 15, 2019**. Test scores and high school GPAs on file at the time of awarding will be used to determine scholarship eligibility.

Scholarships and grants are competitive and funds are limited; therefore, we encourage you to submit your scholarship application as soon as possible.

High Flyers Scholarship*

A merit-based scholarship for incoming Tennessee residents who have just graduated from high school. It is renewable as long as the student maintains full-time continuous enrollment, and has a 3.25 institutional cumulative GPA by end of their fifth semester at Tech.

Golden Opportunity Grant

An institutional need-based grant for incoming Tennessee residents who have just graduated high school. Criteria used for awarding include, but are not limited to, financial need, grade point average, ACT score, community-based activities and demonstrated leadership abilities. It is renewable as long as the student maintains full-time continuous enrollment, completes 55 service hours each semester, and has a 3.00 institutional cumulative GPA by the end of their fifth semester at Tech.

Important Scholarship/Grant Details

Students may only receive one of these awards. Funding for scholarships and grants is limited and awarding is competitive. Although, every effort is made to award all qualified candidates, meeting eligibility requirements does not guarantee a scholarship award.

Any student receiving a combination of lottery scholarships, federal and/or state grants, and institutional or private scholarships cannot receive more than the estimated cost of attendance per year, as determined by the Office of Financial Aid. If the total of all offers exceeds that amount, the scholarship/grant amount will be reduced.

Tennessee Tech reserves the right to limit scholarship and grant awards based on available funding. Information will be updated July 1, 2019.
