

**An Act to Initiate a Semiannual Campus Cleanup Day**

- Whereas,** Campus cleanliness is important to the preservation of the campus environment,  
**and,**
- Whereas,** To maintain a good quality of life on campus, as exhibited presently, campus cleanliness must be sustained, **and,**
- Whereas,** Environmental precautions are significant for the longevity of campus preservation, **and,**
- Whereas,** Community cleanup educates students on environmental and sustainability concerns, **and,**
- Whereas,** By promoting and educating the student body on such concerns, the community learns to value the cleanliness of campus,

**NOW THEREFORE,**

**BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF TENNESSEE  
TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY THAT**

- Section 1:** This bill shall be known as the “Keep Campus Clean Act of 2018”
- Section 2:** There will be two campus cleanup days throughout the observed school year.
- Section 3:** The fall semester will have a cleanup day in October to honor sustainability month, and the spring semester will have a cleanup day in April to celebrate Earth Day.
- Section 4:** These events will be organized by the student government’s Environmental and Sustainability committee, while partnering with the efforts of other on-campus environmental clubs such as the Office of Sustainability.
- Section 5:** Gloves, trash bags, and trash pickers will be shared from the available equipment that the Office of Sustainability already own. All other needed funding will be obtained through inter-organizational fundraising.
- Section 6:** The University Service Center is in full support of offering these events as an opportunity to complete required volunteer and community service hours, which will ultimately promote the student participation within these events.
- Section 7:** This Bill shall take effect immediately upon passage by the Student Government Association, the welfare of the students requiring it.
