

SB-F22-007

An Act to Provide for the Funding of Graduate Students' Professional Association Memberships

- Whereas, professional associations are valuable components of many diverse industries within the United States and around the world, and,
- Whereas, many graduate students at Tennessee Tech are not a member of their professions' association, and,
- Whereas, graduate students at Tennessee Tech often do not have any support from their department for joining their respective professional associations, and,
- Whereas, graduate students would benefit greatly from the provision of resources and guidance offered by their association members, and,
- Whereas, student organizations affiliated with these professional associations would benefit from having more graduate students participate in chapter activities, and.
- Whereas, the graduate students that utilize this support by joining their professional associations would bring heightened visibility to the university, potentially enabling the university to accept higher numbers of talented applicants.

NOW THEREFORE,

BE IT ENACTED BY THE STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION OF TENNESSEE TECHNOLOGICAL UNIVERSITY THAT

- Section 1: This bill shall be known as the "Professional Association Funding Act of 2022".
- Section 2: Each University College/Department shall, with the financial backing of the University at the discretion of the Business Office, establish a fund to be used by graduate students within the respective College/Department to pay for the cost of membership to their professional association.
 - Section 2.1: This fund may only be used to cover the base cost of membership for any association. Any student wishing to opt for a higher membership tier must pay any additional cost incurred.
- Section 3: The College of Graduate Studies shall make a form available on their website to allow graduate students to apply for funding.

- Section 4: The College of Graduate Studies shall establish a transparent review process, not to exceed two (2) weeks, to evaluate each application for funding that is received.
- Section 5: The applicant shall, at the conclusion of the review period, be notified of the status of their application via e-mail, at minimum.

Section 5.1: If the application is accepted, funding shall be disbursed to the applicant's account within five (5) business days.

Section 5.2: If the application is denied, the reason for denial, as well as possible remedies, shall be clearly stated in the notification sent to the applicant.

Section 6: This Bill shall take effect immediately upon passage by the Student Government Association, the welfare of the students requiring it.
